#### Keeping Students Safe...

**Before School:** Drop off's before 8:15 am (band, before school activities) Drive up to the front door using the bus driveway.

**Back doors open at 8:15 am.** Please make sure your children are ready to exit the car on the right side only with minimal time devoted to goodbye's, looking for books, etc

Between 7:45 and 8:15 am – Please don't drive into the front parking lot in an attempt to avoid the drop off line in back. Cars stopped at the flagpole to let out students create a backup of staff anxious to get into school and start the day on time. It also forces children to run across the bus lane unattended, which is not safe. Before 8:15 – use the bus lane. After 8:15 – use the back drop off line.

(There is signage in front that says "Do Not Enter, Buses Only between 8:00 - 9:00 am," but that is outdated for our purposes. Use the bus lane before 8:15 and after 8:30 am.)

**Pickups:** Usually we are able to create a double lane of cars entering the back parking lot for pickups, alleviating the backup on Sohier Street. However, due to the snow, there isn't always enough room for two cars coming in with adequate egress for cars leaving. We have begun dismissing student pickups 5 minutes early in order to alleviate this situation, but we still ask for your patience as we try to move the line along as efficiently as possible without compromising student safety.
